1. General information



Welcome to the 2025 EHSAA competition handbook.

Our competitions are held throughout the year. They bring our angling members together to put their skills and experience to the test. They are fun and add some competitiveness and excitement to our club. They are also all designed to target a specific species that is best fished for at that time of year. These competitions are always fished as fair for all entrants as possible. You have just as much chance to take the first place whether you are in a club boat, clinker, Cat or anything in between.

There are categories for juniors, although there is nothing stopping you take first place if you have got the skills! Your target species of choice for any entry might all be different depending on the competition, but as the fishing has proved over the years anyone can win.

Fish Details 2025

No other fish will count towards the competitions for 2025 other than what is on this list. If it isn't on this list it will not count. The fish not included are essentially a mix of mini species and endangered species.

You are only allowed to keep two Sea Bass per day between January 1st and 31st and April 1st and December 31st. Outside of these times bass must not be brought to the scales even if they are returned alive. If any details change throughout the year you will be updated at the booking in station on the day of the competition or via club text, website or Facebook page prior to the competition.

If you wish to return fish alive you will be given priority at weighing times to allow the fish to be weighed and returned safely. Please do not hesitate to phone ahead of returning to shore during the competition to ensure the speedy return of your fish on the day.

Please refer to the competition specific pages for what fish are to be brought to the scales for that competition and only bring those fish to the scales on the day. The winter comp for example will only accept Cod, Dabs and Whiting to be weighed in. Don't forget they must be in a correctly tagged hard container or bucket.

You can bring to the scales the heaviest of each species you catch providing it is on the 2025 competition fish weights list. This means you can weigh in multiple species, but only one of each.

Only one main prize per angler can be claimed plus the pool each day, so you could win 2 prizes over the two days. Overall points and trophies will be won in addition to prizes. The pool will be for the best specimen weighed in each day of the competition, whether it was a target species for the competition or not.

All current competition fish and their weights will count to for this competition. Details for these are on the official fish weights list for 2025 and can be found at the beginning of this guide or available on the website, Facebook page or at the booking desk on the day of the competition. Other fish may be weighed in after the scales have closed and be logged as a club specimen, subject to normal club rules but not counted towards this competition.

START TIMES: STARTS:08:00HRS FINISH – FAST BOATS 16:00HRS, SLOW BOATS 16:30HRS

All fish must be in a pre-tagged, hard bucket or container (no bags) per entry. They must be correctly tagged before being handed over and only contain the fish being entered for the competition. 7. Winter Comp - 2025 Details and Categories

You will bring to the scales a maximum of 4 fish:
(A total of four fish)

1. One Cod.

Only one main prize per angler can be claimed plus the pool.

Only Cod, Dab & Whiting will count for this competition. Details for these are on the official fish weights list for 2025 and can be found at the beginning of this guide or available on the website, Facebook page or at the booking desk on the day of the competition. Other fish may be weighed in after the scales have closed and be logged as a club specimen, subject to normal club rules but not counted towards this competition.

START TIMES: STARTS 08:00HRS FINISH – FAST BOATS 15:00HRS, SLOW BOATS 15:30HRS

All fish must be in a pre-tagged, hard bucket or container (no bags) per entry. They must be correctly tagged before being handed over and only contain the fish being entered for the competition. Scales for the competition will close 30 mins after the last boat is in back on the beach or the last bucket is weighed and results verified. All live fish for return will take priority. Please refer to the club competition rules and angling bylaws for more details.



8. Competition Rules



1. Entry fees will be decided annually by the committee.
2. Fishing times are 08.00 to 16:00 HRS for fast boats. Boats under 10 knots may return by no later than 16:30HRS. These times may be adjusted for the winter comp. The Scales will close 30 minutes after the last boat is back on the beach.
3. Before going afloat, all competitors must individually book in at the clubhouse. All boats with crew names must be signed out in the book in the weighing in room. Failure to do so may result in disqualification.
4. Competition weights and sizes, which are reviewed annually shall apply. These will be posted in the weighing in room and supplied on the day. No fish to be removed until after all fish are weighed unless the fish is alive and needs returning to the sea. Every competitor is responsible for the collection of their own fish from the weighing in room or they may be disqualified.
5. Anglers are not allowed to enter the weighing in shed during the weigh-in.
6. All anglers to bring their own fish to the weigh-in station on landing and the angler must make their own decision on what fish to weigh in before presenting them to the weighing station. Priority will be given to live fish to be returned.
7. All fish must be tagged before presenting to the weigh-in shed in a hard bucket or container, plastic bags will not be accepted. They must only contain the fish being presented for the competition for the angler on the tag.
8. No undersize fish are allowed. All shads, mackerel, tope & silver eel are banned and will disqualify. The list of banned fish may be changed or added to at any time and will be notified on the competition specific sheets on sign in of each competition.
9. In case of breakdown, a boat may tow you home. Any delay in getting home may not disqualify. Once taken in tow, towing must continue until reaching EHSAA.
10. Once launched boats must wait in the EHSAA harbour area for the horn to signal the start the comp. In the interest of safety, competitors in fast boats are requested to show due care and consideration to smaller and slower boats when leaving the harbour area. The Commodore has been empowered to act against competitors/ boat owners disregarding this request.
11. All persons on the boat must be in the competition.

8. Competition Rules



12. The competition will be called on or off at 1pm by the comp secretary on the day before the comp is held. Notification will be sent by text message. If the weather unexpectedly deteriorates overnight, then the boatman/Commodore reserves the right to either restrict the fishing area or distance or cancel on the morning of the comp. In the event of bad weather and for safety reasons the Commodore / Boatman has the right to call boats back to shore. If a competition is cancelled it will be fished on the next available Saturday or Sunday.

13. Boats fishing the competition will get priority launch and retrieval on comp days.

14. Our competitions are open to all our Angling members. Junior Anglers can fish and weigh-in in their own category and will be allowed to, should their fish qualify, take the cup or prize regardless of how many junior entrants. Juniors catches will also count towards the main category.

15. The comp Secretary, assistant comp sec or person officially appointed by the comp sec will weigh in the fish. All prizes, cups & trophies are awarded as per the competition specific category sheet available for each competition. Calculations are worked out by percentage. Specimen fish caught on the day will be transferred to the specimen book by the comp Secretary (fish recorder?) for eligibility for the annual cups and trophies. A pool prize will be awarded for the best specimen fish at the end of each competition. The pool is not available for junior anglers.

16. All other EHSAA rules and bylaws where applicable also apply to competitions.

9. Angling Bylaws



1. When angling, a member may use one or two rods with reels with running lines, but no more than three hooks between the two rods. A treble hook shall count as one hook.
2. The restriction to three hooks shall not apply when fishing for bait provided that specimen fish taken in this way shall be ineligible for annual cups and prizes or club competitions.
3. Reserve rods are allowed each member.
4. Another member may bait the hooks, gaff or net or unhook fish but otherwise shall not handle the rod, tackle, or the fish.
5. All undersize fish shall be returned to the sea and all fish retained by the angler must be quickly killed in a humane manner unless kept alive in an aerated live bait tank or similar.
6. All specimen fish caught from a boat or Kayak must be weighed by a member of the Club or a Boatman on the club scales. The member catching the fish shall sign the counterfoil in the Specimen Book; otherwise the fish will be ineligible for any award. Family members fishing from the same boat as the captor (e.g. father and son, husband, and wife) may not weight in each other's fish.
7. Specimen fish caught from the beach or Pier shall be weighed by an independent witness, i.e. someone not related to or fishing with the captor.
8. Only one specimen per species can be weighed in on any one day.
9. The Committee shall review the Premier and Specimen weights annually. Any alterations to these weights shall not apply until the 1st January of the following year.
10. Boundaries for weighing in beach specimens shall extend from the west bank of the River Rother estuary to the Cooden Resort Hotel.
11. No member is eligible to weigh in specimen fish until all money owed by them to the Association is paid.
12. The committee shall decide the winners of all annual cups and prizes and in doing so shall select the heaviest fish first.

9. Angling Bylaws



13. Trophies involving Premier and Specimen fish shall be judged as best fish related as a percentage of the premier Specimen fish weights. In the event of a tie where points count, the greatest total percentage weight in comparison with Premier Specimen weights shall decide.

14. Any member, whether out for specimen fish or not, who fishes with more than two rods or three hooks attached to running line (except when fishing for bait), hand lines, long lines or sand lines, or who does not at all times comply with the definition of fair angling laid down in Rule 1, shall forfeit the right to weigh in specimen fish and enter any of the Association's competitions for the remainder of the current financial year. Any specimen fish recorded in his or her name during that year shall be deleted from the Specimen List.

15. All annual trophy winners are responsible for their safe keeping and return by the 14th January in good order and cleaned. Competition trophies must be returned at least four weeks prior to the next year's event. Any member not returning trophies by the due date or in an unacceptable condition may result in that member not being allowed to remove trophies from club premises in future.

16. The gutting of fish on the Club Stade is only allowed in the weigh-in area on the table provided. The guts, frames, heads etc. must be removed from the Club Stade and placed below the high-water mark by the captor(s). It is not part of the Boatmen's duties to dispose of unwanted fish or guts.

17. The use of pots to catch whelks, crabs, lobsters, or prawns can only be carried out by boats who hold a permit issued by the Sussex IFCA.

Useful information

The decision to go afloat will be made at 1pm the day before the competition based on the available weather and sea conditions at that time. Updates to this will be sent out by text on the club text phone at this time. Please ensure you are signed up to this for the most up to date information.

All competition start times may be brought forward if all boats that are fishing the competition are afloat ahead of schedule and ready to go. This decision will be at the discretion of the Comp Sec on the day.

Entry Fees for 2025

£10 per adult angler to enter on the day, £1 of which is put towards the pool.
£5 per junior angler to enter on the day.

Pool Details

The pool entry fee is added to a pot at each competition, and the best specimen fish each day of the competition takes the pool money at the end. The fish for the best specimen is based on the normal club specimen weights which is different from the competition weights. Juniors are not eligible to enter the pool.

Tip of the day!

Its always worth weighing in your catch, you never know what will win until all the fish have been on the scales.
